# The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of Survey and the Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at **Sacramento, California,** accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that **The Iron Mountain Investment Company**

has entered and paid for the **Harding lode mining claim,**

designated ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ as **Survey No. 5940,** embracing a portion of Sections **thirty-five and thirty-six** in Township **thirty-three north** of Range **six west** of the **Mount Diablo Meridian,** in the **Flat Creek Mining District,** **Shasta County, California,**

and bounded, described, and platted as follows: Beginning **at corner No. 1,** an iron pipe **thirty inches long,** two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked **H 1 5940** from which the **southeast corner** to Section **thirty-five** in Township **thirty-three north** of Range **six west** of the **Mount Diablo Meridian,** bears **south one degree fifty-two minutes east one thousand five hundred one and seventeen-hundredths feet distant;**

Thence, first course, **north twenty-four degrees forty minutes twenty seconds west four hundred twenty-seven and four-tenths feet** to corner **No. 3** of **Survey No. 5830** the **Flanders lode claim,** also intersect **line 4 - 1** of **Survey No. 4521,** the **North Star lode claim,** at **south seventy two degrees twenty-six minutes forty seconds west one hundred forty-one and fifty-five-hundredths feet** from corner **No. 4;** **one thousand twenty-eight and eighty-four-hundredths feet** to corner **No. 2** of **Survey No. 5831**

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the Prince Albert lode claim, also intersect line 2 - 3 of said Survey No. 4521, at south seventy-two degrees thirty-three minutes thirty-three seconds west two hundred fourteen and ninety-nine-hundredths feet from corner No. 3; one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 2, an iron pipe thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H 2 5940;

Thence, second course, north sixty-nine degrees thirty-seven minutes east fifty-one and sixty-four-hundredths feet intersect line 1 - 2 of said Survey No. 5831, at north eighteen degrees twenty-three minutes west four hundred seventy and twelve-hundredths feet from corner No. 2; six hundred feet to corner No. 3, an iron pipe thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H 3 5940;

Thence, third course, south twenty-four degrees forty minutes twenty seconds east five hundred ninety-six and sixteen-hundredths feet intersect the west boundary of the southwest quarter of Section thirty-six in Township thirty-three north of Range six west of the Mount Diablo Meridian; one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 4, an iron pipe thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H 4 5940;

Thence, fourth course, south sixty-nine degrees thirty-seven minutes west three hundred feet to a point from which discovery bears north twenty-four degrees forty minutes twenty seconds west one thousand three hundred fifty feet distant; four hundred fifty-eight and eighty-four-hundredths feet intersect the west boundary of said southwest quarter of Section thirty-six; five hundred eighty-six and fifty-four-hundredths feet intersect line 3 - 4 of said Survey No. 5830, at south twenty-six degrees twenty-eight minutes east four hundred twenty-eight and sixty-one-hundredths feet from corner No. 3; six hundred feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning;-expressly excepting and excluding

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from these presents all that portion of the ground hereinbefore described, embraced in said mining claims or Surveys Nos. 5830, 4521, and 5831; and said southwest quarter of Section thirty-six and also all that portion of the Harding vein or lode, and of all veins, lodes, and ledges, throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of such excluded ground; Survey No. 5940 extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Harding vein or lode; the premises herein granted, containing thirteen acres and seventy-two thousandths of an acre.

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NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore, pursuant to the laws aforesaid, hereby granted by the United States unto the said  
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the said mining premises hereinbefore described, and not expressly excepted from these presents, and all that portion of the said vein, lode, or ledge, and of all other veins, lodes, and ledges throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of the surface boundary lines of said granted premises in said survey extended downward vertically, although such veins, lodes, or ledges in their downward course may so far depart from a perpendicular as to extend outside the vertical side lines of said premises: Provided, That the right of possession to such outside parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges shall be confined to such portions thereof as lie between vertical planes drawn downward through the end lines of said survey so continued in their own direction that such planes will intersect such exterior parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges: And provided further, That nothing herein contained shall authorize the grantee herein to enter upon the surface of a claim owned or possessed by another.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said grantee above named and to **its successors** and assigns forever; subject, nevertheless, to the above-mentioned and to the following conditions and stipulations:

FIRST. That the premises hereby granted shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of the courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

SECOND. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of **California** may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to its complete development.
