To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of Survey and the Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at **Sacramento, California,** accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that **The Iron Mountain Investment Company**

has entered and paid for the **Home Stake, Homestake Fraction, and Home Stake Extension No. 1 lode mining claims,**

designated as **Survey No. 6208,** embracing a portion of Section thirty-four in Township thirty-three north of Range six west of the Mount Diablo Meridian, in the Flat Creek Mining District, Shasta County, California,

and bounded, described, and platted as follows: Beginning **for the description of the Home Stake lode claim, at corner No. 1,** an iron post thirty inches long, one and one half inches in diameter, with brass cap marked **HS 1 HS E No. 1 4 6208,** in mound of stone, from which the southwest section corner of Section thirty-four in Township thirty-three north of Range six west of the Mount Diablo Meridian, bears north eighty-nine degrees nine minutes fifty-one seconds west six hundred seventy-two and twenty-three hundredths feet distant;

Thence, first course, north twenty-seven minutes east one thousand one hundred ninety and fifty-five hundredths feet intersect line 2 - 3 of the Noble lode claim, Survey No. 4135, at north eighty-eight degrees fifty nine minutes west five hundred seventy-nine and forty-one hundredths feet from corner No. 3; one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 2,

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an iron post thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H S 2 H S E No. 1 3 6208;

Thence, second course, south eighty-nine degrees nine minutes fifty-one seconds east five hundred seventy-six and four tenths feet intersect line 3 - 4 of said Noble lode claim, at north six minutes west three hundred eleven and thirty-three hundredths feet from corner No. 3; six hundred feet to corner No. 3, an iron post thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H S 3 6208;

Thence, third course, south twenty-seven minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 4, an iron post thirty inches long, one and one-half inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H S 4 6208, in mound of stone;

Thence, third course, north eighty-nine degrees nine minutes fifty-one seconds west three hundred feet to a point from which discovery point bears north twenty-seven minutes east one hundred feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Home Stake vein or lode;

Beginning, for the description of the Homestake Fraction lode claim, at corner No. 1, an iron post thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H F 1 6208, in mound of stone, from which the west quarter section corner of said Section thirty-four bears north eighty-nine degrees nine minutes fifty-one seconds west one thousand two hundred fifty-two and forty-one hundredths feet distant;

Thence, first course, south eighty-nine degrees nine minutes fifty-one seconds east seventy-nine feet to a point from which discovery

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point bears south twenty-seven minutes west seven hundred ninety-seven and sixty-seven hundredths feet distant; one hundred fifty-eight feet to corner No. 2, an iron post thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H F 2 6208, in mound of stone;

Thence, second course, south twenty-seven minutes west twenty-seven and fifty-six hundredths feet intersect the south boundary of the northwest quarter of Section thirty-four in Township thirty-three north of Range six west; also intersect the north boundary of the east half of the southwest quarter of said Section thirty-four, at south eighty-eight degrees two minutes forty-three seconds east sixty-seven and two hundredths feet from the northwest corner; one thousand one hundred eighty-seven and sixty-seven hundredths feet to corner No. 3 an iron post thirty inches long, one and one half inches in diameter with brass cap marked H F 3 6208, in mound of stone;

Thence, third course, north eighty-nine degrees nine minutes fifty-one seconds west sixty-seven feet intersect the west boundary of said east half of the southwest quarter of Section thirty-four, at south twenty-seven minutes west one thousand one hundred sixty-one and forty-two hundredths feet from the northwest corner; ninety and six tenths feet intersect line 3 - 4 of said Noble lode claim, at south six minutes east one thousand one hundred eighty-three and seventeen hundredths feet from corner No. 4; one hundred fifty-eight feet to corner No. 4, an iron post thirty inches long, one and one-half inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H F 4 6208; situate on line 2 - 3 of said Home Stake lode claim;

Thence, fourth course, north twenty-seven minutes east one thousand one hundred sixty-three and twenty-two hundredths feet intersect

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the south boundary of said northwest quarter of Section thirty-four; one thousand one hundred eighty-two and seven tenths feet intersect line 4 - 1 of said Noble lode claim, at north eighty-nine degrees thirty minutes eleven seconds west fifty-six and five hundredths feet from corner No. 4; one thousand one hundred eighty-seven and sixty-seven hundredths feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand one hundred eighty-seven and sixty-seven hundredths feet in length along said Homestake Fraction vein or lode;

Beginning, for the description of the Home Stake Extension No. 1 lode claim, at corner No. 1, an iron post thirty inches long, one and one half inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H S E No. 1 1 6208, in mound of stone, from which said section corner bears north eighty-nine degrees nine minutes fifty-one seconds west seventy-two and twenty-three hundredths feet distant;

Thence, first course, north twenty-seven minutes east one thousand one hundred ninety-five and five hundredths feet intersect line 2 - 3 of the Scott lode claim, Survey No. 4135, at north eighty-eight degrees forty-three minutes thirty seconds west five hundred seventy-seven and five tenths feet from corner No. 3; one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 2, an iron post thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked H S E No. 1 2 6208;

Thence, second course, south eighty-nine degrees nine minutes fifty-one seconds east five hundred seventy-five and two hundredths feet intersect line 3-4 of said Scott lode claim, also line 1 - 2 of said Noble lode claim, at north three hundred nine and four tenths

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feet from corners Nos. 3 and 2, respectively; six hundred feet to corner No. 3, identical with corner No. 2 of said Home Stake lode claim;

Thence, third course, south twenty-seven minutes west three hundred nine and forty-five hundredths feet intersect line 2 - 3 of said Noble lode claim, at south eighty-eight degrees fifty-nine minutes east twenty-two and fifty-five hundredths feet from corner No. 2; one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 4, identical with corner No. 1 of said Home Stake lode claim;

Thence, fourth course, north eighty-nine degrees nine minutes fifty-one seconds west three hundred feet to a point from which discovery bears north twenty-seven minutes east four hundred feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Home Stake Extension No. 1 vein or lode; - expressly excepting and excluding from these presents all that portion of the ground hereinbefore described, embraced in said Scott and Noble lode claims Survey No. 4135 and said east half of the southwest quarter and said northwest quarter Section thirty-four, and also all veins, lodes, and ledges, throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of such excluded ground; the premises herein granted, containing thirty-two acres and two hundred thirty-six thousandths of an acre.

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NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore, pursuant to the laws aforesaid, hereby granted by the United States unto the said
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the said mining premises hereinbefore described, and not expressly excepted from these presents, and all that portion of the said vein **S**, lode **S**, or ledge **S**, and of all other veins, lodes, and ledges throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of the surface boundary lines of said granted premises in said survey extended downward vertically, although such veins, lodes, or ledges in their downward course may so far depart from a perpendicular as to extend outside the vertical side lines of said premises: Provided, That the right of possession to such outside parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges shall be confined to such portions thereof as lie between vertical planes drawn downward through the end lines of said survey so continued in their own direction that such planes will intersect such exterior parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges: And provided further, That nothing herein contained shall authorize the grantee herein to enter upon the surface of a claim owned or possessed by another.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said grantee above named and to **its successors** and assigns forever; subject, nevertheless, to the above-mentioned and to the following conditions and stipulations:

FIRST. That the premises hereby granted shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of the courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

SECOND. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of **California** may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to its complete development.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, **Franklin D. Roosevelt,**

President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
