The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of Survey and the Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at **Sacramento, California,** accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that **The Iron Mountain Investment Company**

has entered and paid for the **Midget lode mining claim,**

designated by the Surveyor General as **Survey No. 5447,** embracing a portion of Section **thirty-five** in Township **thirty-three** north of Range **six** west of the **Mount Diablo Meridian,** in the **Flat Creek Mining District,** **Shasta County,** **California,**

and bounded, described, and platted as follows: Beginning **at corner No. 1,** an iron pipe **thirty** inches long, **two** inches in diameter, marked **M 1 5447,** with mound of stone; from which the west quarter corner of Section **thirty-five** in Township **thirty-three** north of Range **six** west of the **Mount Diablo Meridian,** bears south **seventy-seven** degrees **eleven** minutes **fifty-five** seconds west **five** hundred **eighty-seven** and **forty-four-hundredths** feet distant;

Thence, first course, south **eighty-eight** degrees **fifteen** minutes east **one thousand four hundred ninety-nine** feet to corner **No. 2,** an iron pipe **thirty** inches long, **two** inches in diameter, marked **M 2 5447,** with mound of stone;

Thence, second course, south **one** degree **forty-five** minutes west

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fifty-three and eighteen-hundredths feet intersect line 1 - 2 of the Concord lode claim, Survey No. 4521, at north fifty-nine degrees thirty-seven minutes east three hundred eighty-two and sixty-six-hundredths feet from corner No. 1; one hundred feet to corner No. 4 of the Harbor Light lode claim, Survey No. 4139; three hundred eleven and thirty-seven-hundredths feet to corner No. 3, an iron pipe thirty inches long, two inches in diameter marked M 3 - 5447;

Thence, third course, north eighty-six degrees seventeen minutes fifteen seconds west three hundred eight and eighty-five-hundredths feet intersect line 2 - 3 of the Alta lode claim, Survey No. 4521 and line 4-1 of said Concord lode claim, at south seventeen degrees twenty-eight minutes twenty-nine seconds east forty-six and sixty-eight-hundredths feet from corners Nos. 2 and 1, respectively; one thousand four hundred ninety nine and eighty-eight-hundredths feet to corner No. 4, an iron pipe thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, marked M 4 5447;

Thence, fourth course, north one degree forty-five minutes east one hundred fourteen and twenty-eight-hundredths feet intersect line 1-2 of said Alta lode claim, at north eighty-two degrees fifty-one minutes fifteen seconds west one thousand one hundred eighty and two-tenths feet from corner No. 2; one hundred thirty feet to a point from which discovery cut bears south eighty-eight degrees fifteen minutes east five hundred seventy-nine feet distant; one hundred sixty feet to corner No.

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1 of said Harbor Light lode claim; and from corner No. 1 corner No. 4 bears south eighty-eight degrees fifteen minutes east one thousand four hundred ninety-nine feet distant; two hundred sixty feet to corner No. 1 the place of beginning;-expressly excepting and excluding from these presents all that portion of the ground hereinbefore described, embraced in said Alta and Concord lode claims, Survey No. 4521 and said Harbor Light lode claim, Survey No. 4139, and also all that portion of the Midget vein or lode, and of all veins, lodes, and ledges, throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of such excluded ground; Survey No. 5447 extending one thousand four hundred ninety-nine feet in length along said Midget vein or lode; the premises herein granted, containing three acres and eighteen-hundredths of an acre.

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NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore, pursuant to the laws aforesaid, hereby granted by the United States unto the said **The Iron Mountain Investment Company**

the said mining premises hereinbefore described, and not expressly excepted from these presents, and all that portion of the said vein, lode, or ledge, and of all other veins, lodes, and ledges throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of the surface boundary lines of said granted premises in said survey extended downward vertically, although such veins, lodes, or ledges in their downward course may so far depart from a perpendicular as to extend outside the vertical side lines of said premises: Provided, That the right of possession to such outside parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges shall be confined to such portions thereof as lie between vertical planes drawn downward through the end lines of said survey so continued in their own direction that such planes will intersect such exterior parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges: And provided further, That nothing herein contained shall authorize the grantee herein to enter upon the surface of a claim owned or possessed by another.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said grantee above named and to **its successors** and assigns forever; subject, nevertheless, to the above-mentioned and to the following conditions and stipulations:

FIRST. That the premises hereby granted shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of the courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

SECOND. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of **California** may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to its complete development.

President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
