The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of Survey and the Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at **Sacramento, California,** accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that **The Iron Mountain Investment Company,**

has entered and paid for the **Paradise lode mining claim,**

designated by the Surveyor General as **Survey No. 5446,** embracing a portion of **Section thirty-five** in Township thirty-three north and **Section two** in Township thirty-two north all in **Range six west** of the **Mount Diablo Meridian,** in the **Flat Creek Mining District,** **Shasta County, California,**

and bounded, described, and platted as follows: Beginning at corner No. 1, an iron pipe thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, marked **P 1 5446 M 4,** from which the southwest corner of **Section thirty-five** in Township thirty-three north of **Range six west** of the **Mount Diablo Meridian,** bears north eighty eight degrees fifty-nine minutes eight seconds west five hundred ninety-seven and nine-hundredths feet distant;

Thence, first course, north two degrees fifty-four minutes thirty seconds east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 2, an iron pipe eighteen inches long, two inches in diameter, marked **P 2 5446;**

Thence, second course, east fourteen and twelve-hundredths

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feet intersect line 2 - 3 of Survey No. 4760, the Ohio lode claim, at north ten degrees forty-three minutes forty-eight seconds west five hundred ninety-eight and ninety-three-hundredths feet from corner No. 2; thirty-six and seventeen-hundredths feet intersect line 3 - 4 of said Survey No. 4760 and line 3 - 4 a south line, of the King lode claim, Survey No. 4521; six hundred feet to corner No. 3, an iron pipe thirty inches long, two inches in diameter, marked P 3 5446;

Thence, third course, south two degrees fifty-four minutes thirty seconds west eighteen and eighty-four-hundredths feet intersect line 3 - 4 of said Survey No. 4760 and said line 3 - 4 of the King lode claim; five hundred ninety-seven and five-tenths feet intersect line 1 - 2 of said Survey No. 4760 and line 3 - 4 of the Warren lode claim, Survey No. 4521, at south eighty-eight degrees fifty-five minutes fifty seconds east four hundred forty-four and fourteen-hundredths feet from corners Nos. 2 and 3, respectively; one thousand one hundred ten and sixty-two-hundredths feet intersect line 1 - 2 of said Warren lode claim, at north eighty-six degrees thirty-two minutes four seconds east two hundred thirty-seven and ninety-nine-hundredths feet from corner No. 2; one thousand four hundred feet to witness corner to corner No. 4, an iron pipe thirty inches long two inches in diameter, marked W.C. P 4 5446; one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 4, in creek and not established;

Thence, fourth course, west three hundred feet to a point from which discovery bears north two degrees fifty-four minutes thirty seconds east three hundred feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning;—expressly excepting and excluding from these presents all that portion of the ground hereinbefore described, embraced in said mining claims or Survey No. 2760; and said King and Warren lode claims

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Survey No. 4521, and also all that portion of the Paradise vein or lode, and of all veins, lodes, and ledges, throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of such excluded ground; Survey No. 5446 extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Paradise vein or lode; the premises herein granted, containing nine acres and five hundred twenty-nine thousandths of an acre.

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NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore, pursuant to the laws aforesaid, hereby granted by the United States unto the said

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the said mining premises hereinbefore described, and not expressly excepted from these presents, and all that portion of the said vein, lode, or ledge, and of all other veins, lodes, and ledges throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of the surface boundary lines of said granted premises in said survey extended downward vertically, although such veins, lodes, or ledges in their downward course may so far depart from a perpendicular as to extend outside the vertical side lines of said premises: Provided, That the right of possession to such outside parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges shall be confined to such portions thereof as lie between vertical planes drawn downward through the end lines of said survey so continued in their own direction that such planes will intersect such exterior parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges: And provided further, That nothing herein contained shall authorize the grantee herein to enter upon the surface of a claim owned or possessed by another.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said grantee above named and to **its successors** and assigns forever; subject, nevertheless, to the above-mentioned and to the following conditions and stipulations:

FIRST. That the premises hereby granted shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of the courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

SECOND. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of **California** may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to its complete development.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, **Warren G. Harding,**

President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
