The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of Survey and the Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Sacramento, California, accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that The Iron Mountain Investment Company,

has entered and paid for the Prince Albert and Velvet lode mining claims,

designated by the Surveyor General as Survey No. 5831, embracing a portion of Section thirty-five in Township thirty-three north of Range six west of the Mount Diablo Meridian, in the Flat Creek Mining District, Shasta County, California,

and bounded, described, and platted as follows: Beginning for the description of the Prince Albert lode claim, at corner No. 1, an iron pipe thirty inches long, one and one-half inches in diameter, with brass cap marked P A 1 5831 from which the northeast corner to Section thirty-five in Township thirty-three north of Range six west of the Mount Diablo Meridian, bears north thirty-seven degrees twenty-two minutes fifteen seconds east two thousand forty-eight and thirty-one-hundredths feet distant;

Thence, first course, south eighteen degrees twenty-three minutes east one thousand four hundred eighty-five feet to corner No. 2, an iron pipe thirty inches long, one and one-half inches in diameter, with brass cap marked P A 2 5831, with mound of stone;

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Thence second course, south seventy-two degrees thirty-three minutes thirty-three seconds west six hundred feet to corner No. 3, an iron pipe thirty inches long, one and one-half inches in diameter, with brass cap marked P A 3 5831 T 2 4659; identical with corner No. 2 of Survey No. 4659, the Tuxedo lode claim;

Thence, third course, north eighteen degrees twenty-three minutes west one thousand four hundred eighty-five feet to corner No. 4, an iron pipe thirty inches long, one and one-half inches in diameter, with brass cap marked P A 4 5831 T 1 4659; identical with corner No. 1 of said Survey No. 4659;

Thence, fourth course, north seventy-two degrees thirty-three minutes thirty-three seconds east two hundred eight and ninety-one-hundredths feet intersect line 2 - 3 of the Congress lode claim, Survey No. 4676, at north eighty-eight degrees fifteen minutes west three hundred sixty-four and nineteen-hundredths feet from corner No. 2; three hundred feet to a point from which discovery bears south eighteen degrees twenty-three minutes east eight hundred feet distant; five hundred ninety-six and seventy-five-hundredths feet intersect line 1 - 2 of said Congress lode claim, at north two degrees forty-four minutes east one hundred twenty seven and fifty-four-hundredths feet from corner No. 2; six hundred feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand four hundred eighty-five feet in length along said Prince Albert vein or lode;

Beginning, for the description of the Velvet lode claim, at corner No. 1, an iron pipe two inches in diameter, three feet long, with brass cap marked V 1 5831, from which said section corner bears north forty-nine degrees fifty-five minutes fifty-six seconds east one thousand five hundred sixty-nine and fifteen-hundredths feet distant;

Thence, first course, south five degrees ten minutes west three

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hundred sixty-four and ninety-nine-hundredths feet to a point from which discovery bears south sixty degrees twenty-six minutes forty-six seconds west one thousand feet distant; three hundred seventy-six and thirteen-hundredths feet intersect line 1 - 2 of said Congress lode claim, at south two degrees forty-four minutes west two hundred seventeen and seventy-four-hundredths feet from corner No.1; six hundred twenty-four and sixty-nine-hundredths feet intersect line 4 - 1 of said Prince Albert lode claim; seven hundred twenty-nine and ninety-eight-hundredths feet to corner No. 2, an iron pipe three feet long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked V 2 5831;

Thence, second course, south sixty degrees twenty-six minutes forty-six seconds west thirty-six and two-hundredths feet intersect line 2 - 3 of said Congress lode claim; five hundred fifty-three and eighty-three hundredths feet intersect line 1 - 2 of said Survey No. 4659, at south eighteen degrees twenty-three minutes east two hundred thirteen and forty-five-hundredths feet from corner No. 1; one thousand one hundred sixty-five and thirty-three-hundredths feet intersect line 3-4 of said Survey No. 4659, at south eighteen degrees twenty-three minutes east three hundred forty-one and seventy-nine-hundredths feet from corner No. 4; and from corner No. 4 corner No. 1 bears north seventy-two degrees thirty-three minutes thirty-three seconds east six hundred feet distant; one thousand four hundred fifty-eight and ninety-five-hundredths feet intersect the east boundary of Lot twelve of Section thirty-five in Township thirty-three north of Range six west of the Mount Diablo Meridian; one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 3, an iron pipe three feet long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked V 3 5831;

Thence, third course, north five degrees ten minutes east

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seven hundred twenty-nine and ninety-eight-hundredths feet to corner No.4 an iron pipe three feet long, two inches in diameter, with brass cap marked V 4 5831;

Thence, fourth course, north sixty degrees twenty-six minutes forty-six seconds east forty and ninety-nine-hundredths feet intersect the east boundary of said Lot twelve of Section thirty-five; sixty-one and five-tenths feet intersect line 2 - 3 of said Congress lode claim; one thousand one hundred ninety-five and ninety-eight-hundredths feet intersect line 4 - 1 of said Congress lode claim, at north eighty-eight degrees eighteen minutes west two hundred forty-one and nine-hundredths feet from corner No. 1; one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Velvet vein or lode;-expressly excepting and excluding from these presents all that portion of the ground hereinbefore described, embraced in said mining claims or Survey No. 4659; said Congress lode claim Survey No. 4676; and said Lot twelve of Section thirty-five, and also all veins, lodes, and ledges, throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of such excluded ground; the premises herein granted, containing twenty-five acres and twenty-two thousandths of an acre.

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NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore, pursuant to the laws aforesaid, hereby granted by the United States unto the said
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the said mining premises hereinbefore described, and not expressly excepted from these presents, and all that portion of the said vein **S**, lode **S**, or ledge **S**, and of all other veins, lodes, and ledges throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of the surface boundary lines of said granted premises in said survey extended downward vertically, although such veins, lodes, or ledges in their downward course may so far depart from a perpendicular as to extend outside the vertical side lines of said premises: Provided, That the right of possession to such outside parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges shall be confined to such portions thereof as lie between vertical planes drawn downward through the end lines of said survey so continued in their own direction that such planes will intersect such exterior parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges: And provided further, That nothing herein contained shall authorize the grantee herein to enter upon the surface of a claim owned or possessed by another.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said grantee above named and to **its successors** and assigns forever; subject, nevertheless, to the above-mentioned and to the following conditions and stipulations:

FIRST. That the premises hereby granted shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of the courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

SECOND. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of **California** may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to its complete development.
